

External Evaluation/Assessment for PG Courses

The evaluation scheme for each course shall contain two parts; (a) Internal evaluation and (b) External evaluation. 25% weightage shall be given to internal evaluation and the remaining 75% to external evaluation and the ratio and weightage between internal and external is 1:3. Both internal and external evaluation shall be carried out using direct grading system.

Attendance

The minimum requirement of aggregate attendance during a semester for appearing the end semester examination shall be 75%. A student who does not satisfy the requirements of attendance shall not be permitted to take the end Semester examinations.

External Evaluation

The external Examination in theory courses is to be conducted by the University with question papers set by external experts. The evaluation of the answer scripts shall be done by examiners based on a well-defined scheme of valuation. The Direct Grading System based on a 6 - point scale is used to evaluate the performance

EXAMINATIONS

There shall be a University examination at the end of each semester. Practical examinations shall also be conducted by the University. Project evaluation and Viva -Voce shall be conducted at the end of the programme only. There shall be one end-semester examination of 3 hours duration in each lecture based course and practical course.

Project work

Project work shall be completed by working outside the regular teaching hours. Project work shall be carried out under the supervision of a teacher in the concerned department. A candidate may, however, in certain cases be permitted to work on the project in an industrial / Research Organization on the recommendation of the Supervisor. There should be an internal assessment and external assessment for the project work. The external evaluation of the Project work is followed by presentation of work including dissertation and Viva-Voce.

Comprehensive Viva-voce

Comprehensive Viva-voce shall be conducted at the end semester of the program comprehensive Viva-Voce covers questions from all courses in the programme.

No separate minimum is required for internal evaluation for pass, but a minimum C grade is required for a pass in an external evaluation. However, a minimum C grade is required for pass in a course. A student who fails to secure a minimum grade to pass in a course will be permitted to write the examination along with the next batch.
