The Curriculum Feedback committee evaluated the feedbacks from various stakeholders and took the following decisions:

- The lack Skill based components inside syllabus is a major concern and should be reported to university on all available occasions. The need of activity oriented syllabus should also be brought into focus. The syllabus also needs to be inclusive of its applications, rather than being theoretical alone.
- Introducing and familiarizing more ICT enabled Methods
- Students shall be encouraged to pursue online courses for achieving additional skills.
- More programmes relating to Entrepreneurship Development shall be organized by the Departments and IEDC.
- Extra online sessions shall be provided for students for covering the portions
- Departments shall arrange special sessions and webinars relating to recent developments in the topic.
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Action Taken Report on Curriculum Feedback suggestions

Based on the decisions of the meeting for analyzing the feedbacks obtained from various stakeholders, the following steps were implemented as part of strengthening effectiveness of curricular delivery.

- The Principal and members of various Board of studies and University bodies took initiative for reporting the matters related to improvement in curriculum content.
- More smart rooms, ICT enabled Class rooms were constructed and training programmes on ICT tools were conducted
- A virtual learning committee was formed to monitor online teaching -learning and for promoting enrolment in MOOC Courses
- All clubs and subject associations shall organize and arrange events helpful for enrichment of curriculum.
- The IEDC arranged interactive lecture series with leading and budding entrepreneurs. The students participated in programmes like YIP to present their ideas.
- Online sessions and webinars were arranged by the departments regarding various areas of developments.
- Introduced more Certificate Programmes

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
